Our programmes

DASS outreach service

Support and advocacy service for 16+ year olds, working with those at all risks of harm from intimate partners, ex-partners or family members to secure their safety and the safety of their children. The service will provide a One Stop Shop that offers advice and support appropriate to the needs of each specific situation. The outreach service works with those from all genders and sexualities.

Programmes

Seeking Safety: a 12-week programme with safety as the overarching goal, helping clients attain safety in their relationships, thinking, behaviour and emotions.

Freedom: a 12-week domestic violence course identifying the roles, attitudes and beliefs of the abuser, and helping victims make sense of what has happened to them.

Men & Masculinities

A programme designed to support men to make positive changes, and accompanying Women's Support Service (CWSS) that provides support, empowerment and safety for women whose (ex-)partners are attending the Men & Masculinities programme.

Women using abusive behaviours

A 16-week one to one programme for females

that are identified as the primary or predominant aggressor with accompanying (ex)partner support.

Children and young person's programme

A 10-week one-to-one programme for children aged 10-18 yrs. The programme will cover the impact of domestic abuse on children and keeping children emotionally and physically safe. It will provide a safe, nurturing and positive space for children to play, express their feelings, build resilience and improve emotional health.

LGBT+

A newly developed 12-week victims/survivor offer for those identifying as members of the LGBT+ community.

Refuge

Provides families experiencing, or at risk of domestic abuse with refuge accommodation and floating support, including short-term support and addressing onward housing needs.
